FALLing Back Into the School Routine

With kiddos back in school and adjusting to a new year, follow these tips to keep your child's hearing aids in tip-top shape this season:

- Hearing aids can have a lot of small pieces, and if there's any specific equipment that's for school only (such as a classroom FM system) talk with the child's teacher and discuss a "safe spot" for them to stay in the classroom.
- Pro tip: Include extra hearing aid/hearing technology supplies for the school to keep, such as batteries and extra tubing.
- With the return to school inevitably comes bouts of sickness. Note that congestion can impact your child's hearing temporarily and they may need extra adjustments to your usual communication strategies.

- If your child has changed school systems or is seeing an audiologist at a different clinic, a parent signature may be required on a new release form to allow the clinical audiologist & school audiologist to communicate.
